Other modifications fix items in previous releases, as summarized below.

Module Affected	Description
DENS ASI	Clients with birth dates on 2/29 of any leap year had an error message appear when completing marital status on the DENS ASI. This is now corrected.
Client Progress Report	 Employment status, name of employer, highest grade completed, and school vocational training enrollment now pull from the agency records in a slightly different manner. All pull only from the agency which is requesting the report. See Client Progress Report TIP sheet for further details. Current Phase pulls from the most recent court and other justice record in the agency requesting the Progress Report where a phase was identified. Phase Start Date is the phase associated with Current Phase. Date of last positive drug test is the most recent positive or positive unconfirmed drug test in any agency with an appropriate consent. This date is the most recent, regardless of the requested time period for the Progress Report. Days since last positive test is the Date the Report is being run minus Date of Last Positive Drug Test (see #3 above).
Discharge	Previous versions of SMART allowed users to select "pregnant" for males on discharge. This choice is now prohibited.
